# Then why was 72.2% of the vote of the people ignored?

The Commission had the duty to enter the 1996 Term Limits vote outcome for Eight is Enough into the Charter but never did. Were our votes flushed down the toilet?

## Can this be corrected now?

**YES!** But it will take the Will of the people to demand 8 is Enough be codified and put in the Charter. The result of the 1996 vote exists and the Charter Review Commission (CRC) is the appointed board that can put the term limits in the Charter.

The CRC meets every 8 years to suggest ballot initiatives and changes to the Pinellas Charter.
